#### FINANCE

Mrs. Sroka noted that the Committee met and reviewed a proposed budget which includes no reduction in staff, technology upgrades including a 1:1 Chromebook initiative, new library and STEM materials, as well as additional monies for Clubs. Mrs. Sroka noted that the district continues to look for ways to contain costs including a change in health care benefit providers and shared services for business administrator and child study team services. Mrs. Sroka noted that even with these and other cost containment measures, the loss of state aid will necessitate an increase in the local tax levy. Mrs. Sroka noted that we'll use banked cap to exceed the 2% cap on the local tax levy and increase the tax levy 3.5%, or an increase of 4.5 cents, on the tax rate which would equate to an increase of \$117/year for a homeowner in the Township with an average assessed home valuation of \$259,471.

## APPROVE A TENTATIVE BUDGET FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR FOR SUBMISSION TO THE COUNTY OFFICE

A motion was made by Mrs. Nikolopoulos and seconded by Mrs. Lensi to approve a tentative budget for the 2019-2020 school year for submission to the County Office. This budget includes sufficient funds to provide curriculum and instruction which will enable all students to achieve the New Jersey Student Learning Standards, and is in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A and N.J.A.C. Title 6 and 6A. This budget proposes the use of \$111,395 of banked cap to support the 2019-2020 general fund budget due to the loss of \$139,150 in state aid funding for the 2019-2020 school year.
